Who's Way Is Not Fair?

The mystery of 'life is not fair' continues to perplex us. We can probe with a sincere effort to accept the divine assertion: "My thoughts are not your thoughts; my ways are not your ways."

If we reflect on this mystery in light of how suffering escapes no one, perhaps we can have a reasonable grasp of how God's plan for salvation has much merit.

In God's infinite wisdom of the giving of free will to angels and humans, He permitted the moral evil of sin to become a severe reality. Creatures now can and do say **NO** to God, thereby inflicting a punishment that calls for an adequate remedy beyond fulfillment. Sin causes unlimited harm in that an Infinite God is offended. The entire human race, even by laying down its suffering and dying, can offer at best only what has human value.

Unless God intervenes, this problem is never overcome. It calls for the virtues of justice and charity to be put in place. The Mystery of the Incarnation is the divine answer whereby justice and charity are divinely applied. Jesus teaches us that both divine and human natures can derive infinite value from any of His works or actions. With Christ sweeping the carpenter's shop or raising Lazarus to life we see infinite value with Jesus the Divine Person responsible.

But God's plan called for supreme sacrificial love ("no greater love than he who lays down his life"). Thus, this price entails the Passion and Death of Our Lord whereby both justice and charity are exceedingly demonstrated.

By utilizing such infinite action, such extreme love, redemptive suffering becomes a meritorious reality that can transform 'life is not fair' to "God so loved the world."
