**Truth Matters**

How important is 'truth' to us? It varies as to persons and circumstances. It is accepted as important even for convenience, such as: what time is it or what is the date. My mind is seeking the correct answer but this is found with me accepting a recognized normative gauge – the watch for time and the calendar for date.

As quest for truth hinges on more important issues, does our search and acceptance turn to more certainty for truth and less chance for error? Such a mind set differs with persons especially to the extent that both reason and faith are valued as necessary agents for us humans to arrive at suitable answers.

When the spiritual minded individual is ready to put at the top of the list answers as to what life is all about, he is fortunate to have his search reach the one who has forthrightfully addressed these issues head on without equivocation.

Those who listened carefully to the words of Christ, Scripture tells us, they were sincerely impressed for He spoke with authority and not as the rest of men. So what precious statements can we discover from His lips? "I am the Way, the Truth, and the Life." "The Father and I are One." "The truth will make you free." "Before Abraham came to be, I Am."

This 'I Am' (Yahweh in Hebrew) is the most precious name of God and is at the very heart of what is truth for it established truth as a Person rather than things or statements.

Our Holy Faith captures for us that the three Persons of the Holy Trinity alone are total reality encompassing all that was or is and ever will be which includes all life and being. Truth then, is the totality of existence which alone is the absolute measurement distinguishing clearly truth from false, which is from that which is not.
