Fr Andre' and Tony Costello presented information about ongoing developments of the orphanage in Haiti. Tony explained the history and most recent architectural revisions to the plans for the new orphanage which will expand from the current 17 children to about 80 in the future. Ball State students working with architect Costello have developed award-winning plans for the orphanage. Fr Andre' thanked everyone for their support and specifically mentioned our Council for their monthly core charity support. He noted that "my plans and work focus on repaying God for His goodness." It was a very informative gathering enjoyed by all in attendance.

An Invitation from the Assembly: Consider becoming a 4th Degree Knight

A wonderful opportunity beckons for our 3rd Degree Council members to invite them take the step to become 4th Degree Sir Knights. The 4th Degree for knights is the highest Knighthood attainable. We are fortunate to have a very active 4th Degree Assembly in Muncie doing the good work of the Knights of Columbus and we are seeking new members.

Groundwork for the opportunity was recently gained with several Muncie Knights completing the 3rd Degree at a Council 560 sponsored exemplification in Muncie. Those men along with others already at the 3rd Degree level in the Council are urged to consider becoming 4th Degree Knights. A special 4th Degree exemplification will be held in South Bend on September 14th. A group of Bishop William Arnold Assembly Knights will travel to the exemplification along with the new candidates. Faithful Navigator Bill Moore and the Assembly invite all of you 3rd Degree Knights to become one of the group.

What is the 4th Degree Knighthood all about?

The 4th Degree of the Knights of Columbus are committed to the preservation of the Church, the Order, and the many nations where Knights serve. It is a natural progression for 1st, 2nd and 3rd degree Knights to aspire to join the 4th Degree. Membership in the 4th Degree allows a Knight to display pride in his country, while continuing to serve his community and Church.

To qualify for the Fourth Degree a member must:

- Be 18-years-old or older and a regular Catholic
- Be a citizen of the country in which he resides
- Have been a member of the Order for at least 12 months
- Be a member in good standing within a council
- Be a 3rd Degree Knight

When a Knight joins the 4th Degree, he becomes a member of a group of men dedicated to promoting patriotism illuminated by their Catholic faith. He also earns the right - not obligation - to wear the regalia and to participate in color corps and honor guards at Church, Order and community events. Ideally, every 3rd Degree Knight should strive to become a member of the Fourth Degree. It is a place of honor and respect that its members will carry for the rest of their lives. What will you need to attend the 4th Degree exemplification in South Bend? First complete the Form 100. Then all that remains is the formal attire and some accessories. The 4th degree attire is specific and the responsibility of the candidate. The formal dress includes: tuxedo, black bow tie, white tuxedo shirt, black socks, dark dress shoes (prefer black), standard K of C service baldric, white gloves, black suspenders, and black cummerbund. These items can be purchased (some of the items can be rented) as needed. One source to purchase the baldric and additional items is: The English Company, Inc (www.kofcsupplies.com).
